Currently we will plan to continue the boat parade, the annual meeting and Kids fishing contest. Regarding that we are in need of a volunteer or two take over the fishing contest. We saw tremendous turnout the past few years under Kim and father Bob Kalton's leadership. Thank you Bob and Kim!

Our biggest area of concern going into 2020 is seeing a big decline in membership, currently at 140 members, compared to 190-210 members in years past. We believe our Fall communication for renewal or joining is suspect in that drop off. Many regular on-going members failed to renew. (Remember the benefits of membership keep our AIS funding supplied, provides membership in the Facebook HLPOA page, and most importantly continues a 50-year plus sense of community.) If you have not renewed or are new to a membership, please see the enclosure with in the newsletter for paying the membership dues. Additionally, a mailing was recently sent out to current non-members and we saw a nice increase from that. We certainly appreciate your support.

The lake is currently at a 100 YEAR high water mark. PLEASE NO Large wakes 100' feet from shore to help prevent bank erosion. Remember your neighbors!

Some other tidbits:

- The Mission 4th of July parade will now be moved to the 3rd Saturday in June. (June 20) instead of the 4th of July weekends. It will now be called "The Start of Summer Parade".
- Transfer station is open thru Oct 30. Saturdays only 10am-2pm.

- Recycling is no longer available at Mission Hall due to costs. Currently the closest is in Crosslake off Hwy 3 until May 31st. After that:



COMMITTEE REPORTS

Water Quality and AIS Management



Lake monitoring dates have been set. I will be taking seechi disc readings and collecting water samples on the following dates:

May 18, June 15, July 20, August 17 and September 21. The data and samples are

shipped to RMB Environmental Laboratories in Detroit Lakes for testing and results are added to their data base. The data is then sent to the MPCA.

HLPOA has been involved with the Lake Monitoring program since 2004, so we have 15 years of data for analyzing trends. According to the data, Horseshoe Lake's water quality is on a positive trend. Tropic State Index (TSI), Total Chlorophyll A, and Total Phosphorus are all on a downward trend, which indicates improving water quality. The data is available on RMB Environmental Laboratories website: www.rmbel.com We are very fortunate to live on Horseshoe Lake. Let's all continue to be good stewards of our lake.

Fisheries Management

Kevin Max spoke to Marc Bacigalupi in February regarding the possibility of putting the "Keep Out, Spawning Area" sign back up at the entrance to the bay on the South end of the West basin. He was clear that the answer is "No". He said that the entire lake is open to the public to fish. Marc is the Brainerd Area Fisheries Supervisor for the Mn DNR.

AIS Inspectors

AIS inspectors will **again** continue to be at our landing weekends and summer holidays. Additionally, we have provided them with a **restroom** facility thru September. We have 300 hours paid for by Crow Wing County and the Minnesota DNR. HLPOA will cover the balance of the year after the 300 hours are filled. Thanks for your support! Inspections began on May 15th. (a late start due to training issues)

Wildlife

After ice out, there were three pairs of loons plus one smaller loon, swimming on the lake. One pair of loons has settled on the East couple weeks. The inlet of the West lake has changed. It could be due to the high water level, the environment around the nest or the heavy fishing occurring. Previously, there was no fishing posted. Now the third pair has vanished in the past two weeks. The loon platform that Geoffrey Bartsh set out in the channel remains empty. Please use caution when boating near the loons as the nests are close to the water and the water level remains high.

In other wildlife news, please watch your pets outdoors. A dog was injured by a porcupine, there are sighting of beavers, and telltale signs left behind of bears roaming on Huxtable Point. communicated new Guidelines for use during this pandemic.


- Practice social distancing (essential at boat launches, fishing piers and hunting lands)
- Stay as close to home as possible. This is not the time to be traveling long distances to recreate.
- Do not host large gatherings who are not members of your immediate family. This includes gatherings like outdoor events and cookouts.
- Explore the range of nearby public lands available and if it is busy, choose a different option.
- Do not carpool to outdoor recreational activities other than immediate family. Similarly, do not share equipment.

Being lake property owners, these are very difficult rules to follow, but your adherence to participate in these guidelines will make a difference. Remember: We are all in this together!

Minnesota Lakes and River Advocates

Since the stay at home orders, MLR has put out a number of webinars. Please check the Minnesota Lakes & Rivers website home page for registration links to future webinars. You may also click on links to view recordings of past webinars. These are usually less than 60 minutes. Lake associations are part of the largest, most generous and most committed conservation/angling group in Minnesota, contributing about \$6.25 million towards lake work collectively, and about 1.2 million volunteer hours to protect the public waters, and almost \$400k for annual fish stocking.

Take Action to Increase Boaters Safety, AIS Knowledge and Enhanced Wake Watercraft Training

In mid-March the Legislature recessed due to the Covid-19 outbreak. At that time there were a number of bills MLR was working on:

\$5 million to MN DNR for AIS enhancements to water access sites and Lake Association AIS grants was included in the Governor's recommendation,

- An approximate doubling of AIS fines, with the top set at \$1,000,
- A requirement for the MN DNR and interested parties to recommend a watercraft operator's certification with specific training for public safety, enhanced wake watercraft, and AIS self-inspection,
- Legislation to protect loons, other waterfowl and raptors from lead poisoning due to lead based fishing tackle. Since mid-March the focus has been on Covid-19 related bills. Now, late in the session, stripped down versions of the bills, with many of the spending items removed (\$5 million in AIS funding, etc) are being moved.

The House Bill contains language that requires the MN DNR to convene interested parties to recommend a boater's operating training and certification program. The language asks the Minnesota Aquatic Invasive Species Center to establish Best Management Practices, BMPs for preventing the spread of AIS.

It also asks the fluid dynamics lab at St. Anthony Falls to establish BMPs for preventing damage to lake bottoms and aquatic plants from the operation of watercraft, and the minimum distances boats should operate from shore to prevent damage to sensitive shorelines from wakes.

- > Transfer Station now open Saturdays 10 a.m. 2 pm. Social Distancing is being implemented
- > The Mission Township Board will hold a public meeting on Monday, June 15th at 7:00 p.m. at the Town Hall to present a Road Management Plan. The draft proposal is for \$3.4 million over 5 years to improve the roads in the Township. More information is available on their website (missiontownship.org).
- ➤ Horseshoe Lake residents had asked about having a tornado siren installed at the Mission Township Hall. Most sirens only have about a 1 mile radius coverage. A new siren would cost approximately \$18,000-\$20,000. A better solution is to utilize technology and that most residents have cell phones and/or have weather apps on their phones. Currently all major phone providers have enable emergency alerts on their devices (Tornado warnings/Amber Alerts) anything life threatening should automatically come across a person's phone unless they have physically disabled it. Crow Wing County has purchased a mass notification system, called Crow Wing County ALERT https://crowwing.us/1490/Crow-Wing-County-ALERT



Fire Up the Grill

With so many restaurants still closed and social distancing strongly encouraging Minnesotans to "Stay Safe Minnesota" it's a good time to gather immediate family and fire up the grill. In this corner is a fun, easy and flavorful recipe to prepare for your family:

Jamaican Jerk Chicken

1 4-1/2 oz. can green chilies

1/4 cup lime juice

1 tbsp. rosemary

2 tsp. thyme

2 tbsp. mustard seeds

2 tbsp. Dijon mustard

1/2 yellow onion cut in chunks

2 cloves of garlic chopped

dash of salt

One cut up chicken



Combine the first 9 ingredients in a food processor until it forms a thick, smooth paste. Pat the chicken pieces dry and rub the paste into the chicken. Cover with plastic wrap and refrigerate for 2 hours. Prepare the grill and place the chicken skin side down and cook slowly until done. Transfer the chicken to plates and add sprigs of rosemary and serve. Add some sides such as corn on the cob, spicy cole slaw, green onion biscuits and you have a beachside fiesta! Dessert – (of course!) – Cappuccino Walnut Brownies with ice cream!
