

RECYCLE

We no longer have our local recycling facility, but have a recommendation, Ideal Corners Transfer Station, near the end of West Island Lake Drive off County Rd. 16, Phone: 218-543-6372.

It is clean and organized, with separate containers by material cardboard, glass. (paper, aluminum, plastic, etc.). They also recycle appliances for a small fee. Cost is \$15 per year for unlimited recycling, one load of yard waste, one load of brush. Hours 8am to 4pm, Wednesday and Saturday all year plus Mondays during the summer. Fruit on the Grill!

What could be better than a delightful peach dessert with raspberry sauce and lemon cream? Grilling has never tasted so good! Best of all – you are out of a hot kitchen for summer entertaining!!

For the Raspberry Sauce:

3 cups fresh raspberries, 1 tbsp lemon juice, 1 tbsp tequila and 2-4 tbsp sugar Mix the berries with 1/3 cup water. Strain into bowl and add remaining ingredients

For the Lemon Cream:

1 cup heavy cream, 1 tbsp sugar, 1 tbsp lemon juice, 2 tsp lemon zest

Whip cream and sugar at high speed and add the remaining ingredients. Refrigerate until serving time. 6 large peaches, 6 tbsp unsalted butter, ½ c granulated sugar. Melt butter and add sugar. Brush mixture on halved peaches. Grill over Direct High heat turning every 2-3 minutes until browned. Serve warm peaches with sauce and lemon cream – 6 servings

EYE ON IT

Are Picture Perfect Lawns on Their Way Out?

The American lawn has deep roots in our nation's founding story, but environmental concerns have sparked interest in native plants and a wildlife-friendly landscape.

Traditional lawns are huge water hogs, and they need fertilizers and a lot of ongoing care. By going from manicured to natural we teach property owners to shift to buffer zones (unmowed strips of trees and native plants) that absorb lawn chemicals before they reach the water.

historic With drought conditions and water supplies becoming threatened, we can nurture a better future by using more native plants. This will also increase the populations of butterflies, songbirds, and pollinators. Experts recommend starting small. Carve out a little piece of your lawn for a few native shrubs and some perennials that you love. For more information on how to develop natural into the new beautiful, contact Crow Wing County Soil and Water at 218-828-6197. For a fee, they will assess, design, and plant native species and work with you to shift to a new shoreline aesthetic. The good news:

ANNUAL MEETING


