

Keeping our lake free of invasive species is of utmost importance. Please decontaminate your watercraft after using it on another lake and remind your guests to do the same. The Crosslake decontamination station is no longer open, but use the following link to find other locations:

Aquatic Invasive Species inspectors will monitor watercraft at the public landing from 10:00 am – 6:00 pm on Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays throughout the summer. These hours include those provided by the DNR, plus those contracted and paid for by HLPOA. If you are interested in volunteering to staff the landing, the DNR offers free AIS training. EYE ON IT



(The following is from Minnesota Lakes and Rivers, a non-profit group dedicated to preserving and protecting Minnesota's waters)

"Boats today, particularly wake surfing watercraft, are larger, faster and more powerful. Negative impacts on public safety, shoreline, lake beds and diverse recreation are increasing.

Minnesota Lakes and Rivers is taking action to improve safety, prevent negative ecological impacts, and reduce user conflicts on our lakes. Wake boat owners want reliable information on how to operate this watercraft in ways that do not damage lakes, loon nests or feed algae blooms."

The HLPOA board is working with MN Wake to produce and distribute a map of the contours of Horseshoe Lake. The map will designate areas where it is safe to operate wake boats, both to protect the boat from damage and to prevent shoreline erosion and lake bottom destruction.



Asparagus Wraps with Prosciutto and Mozzarella

½ cup Italian dressing

1 teaspoon Dijon mustard

8 oz fresh mozzarella, sliced

1 lb. fresh asparagus, trimmed

2 Tbls. Olive oil, salt and pepper

4 flour tortillas or flavored wraps (8 inch)

12 thin slices of prosciutto, about 6 ounces

Preheat oven to 425 degrees. Mix Italian dressing and Dijon in a shallow dish, then add mozzarella and set aside

To marinate. Toss the asparagus with the olive oil, salt and pepper, transfer to a baking dish and roast 8-10 minutes. Heat a non-stick skillet over medium/high. Brush the inside of each tortilla with marinade, then top with 2-3 slices of mozzarella, 3 slices of prosciutto and ¼ of the asparagus. Tightly roll up wraps, brush the outside with Marinade. Brown wraps-- using any remaining marinade-- in hot skillet until golden and mozzarella slightly melts. Remove from heat, slice in half on the bias and serve with a delicious salad—one with fresh strawberries! (Recipe credit to Cuisine at Home)
